


## Caught in a Daydream

ust three hours north of Denver, hiding, as it were, in the shadow cast by the peaks of Colorado's Park Range Mountains, rests Steamboat Springs: a picture-perfect vacation town where long-time locals and newcomers, cowboys and ski-bums, mingle in the upbeat bistros, dimly-lit bars and old-time Western haberdasheries that dot the streets. In Steamboat Springs, Stetson hats are sold for shade not souvenirs, authenticity oozes from every nook and cranny in town, and the Victorian-era buildings, most of them fronting the main drag of Lincoln Avenue, were built for function, not form.








| Downtown Steamboat Springs

Nestled here, in the historic Yampa Valley, is Alpine Mountain Ranch & Club: a 1,216-acre residential development conveniently close to the Steamboat Ski Resort, Catamount Golf Club, and Routt National Forest. Perched at an elevation of 6,800-feet, Steamboat Springs, a former railroad town, got its name from French trappers who, after hearing the bubbling and churning of the nearby hot springs (another popular nearby activity not to be missed), mistakenly thought a steamboat was chugging up the Yampa River. Since then, lovers of outdoor lifestyle have been flocking to the Park Range foothills seeking everything from slopeside solitude to epic hiking trails to craft cocktails and fine dining.

Alpine Mountain Ranch & Club, which is relatively new to the Northwestern Colorado development scene, offers residents premium access to 1.5-miles of private, live water fishing on the Yampa River in addition to an on-site, stocked fishing lake, five miles of trails for hiking and mountain biking, an equestrian facility and a private backcountry retreat aptly named The Hermitage.
